
Online Seminar on Undergraduate Mathematics Education

Strategies for equitable and engaging mathematics teaching

This talk focuses on practical strategies that college mathematics instructors can use to promote an equitable and engaging classroom environment. In addition to offering specific strategies, I also discuss a learning process that faculty
